ANNUAL REPORT 2022-23



Samaj Vikas Sanstha has been working for the past twenty-five years to uplift marginalized children, distressed women, men, laborers, farmers, people

living in slums, unemployed youth, and young women who are facing human-made and natural disasters. The organization is dedicated to providing assistance, fulfilling their physical needs, bringing about economic changes, and working for the last person affected by the calamities. This work is carried out continuously and uninterruptedly by the organization, which is committed to societal development.

In the fiscal year 2022-23, Samaj Vikas Sanstha has implemented the following projects to assist the neglected.

1. Balwadi Project Pune:

In Pune, Maharashtra, construction workers from both within Maharashtra and outside the state bring their young children along with them. These children do not have access to basic necessities like shelter, safety, education, and proper nutrition. As a result, many children are deprived of their childhood. To provide education to such neglected

children, Samaj Vikas Sanstha has initiated Balwadis (pre-schools) in Hinjawadi, Pune and Mumbai. we have set up six construction sites and have connected 99 children with the flow of education. By imparting knowledge in play, music, storytelling, language and mathematics, efforts have been made to ensure that children do not miss out on the main stream of education.



2. Tree Plantation and Conservation:

Due to massive deforestation, climate change is occurring and nature is being affected. To mitigate this, it is essential to 10000 plant trees, promote tree growth and conserve nature. Trees are crucial for rainfall, as they play a vital role in the precipitation process. To address carbon emissions and provide oxygen, organizations are actively working to spread awareness and engage in direct action. In the year 2022-23, an organization has undertaken the task of planting and preserving ten thousand trees in open spaces, schools, roads, cremation grounds, and similar areas in the Naichakur, Omerga taluka, Osmanabad district. We

have also provided water and nurturing these trees. In the future, these trees will contribute to the production of thousands of tons of oxygen and assist in rainfall.





3. Vatsalya Bal Griha (Orphanage):

Through this project, Samaj Vikas Sanstha provides assistance to children living on the streets, orphaned children, children from marginalized communities, sick children and children who are the most vulnerable. The organization regularly supports these children by providing clothing, shelter, food, education, and healthcare. We also distribute rations to children living in slums and provide both old and new clothes. In the fiscal year 2022-2023 we have assisted 277 children

economically and provided support with 407 sets of old clothes. We have also provided clothes to parents, laborers and children in need.



4. BFSI Banking finance services and insurance Youth Training Center in Govandi, Mumbai:

For the past seven years, a training center has been operational in Govandi, Mumbai, specifically for young people. It provides training in banking, finance, insurance, and selecting borrowers. Through interactive sessions, computer videos, and training modules, we educate young individuals about loan regulations and procedures, how to obtain a loan, how to manage regular repayments, and the importance of building a good relationship with banks. We aim to empower young people by equipping them with knowledge about the banking process and helping them understand loan procedures. Samaj Vikas sanstha provides training to youth, facilitating job opportunities through this training. We have provided training to a total of 135 young individuals in Govandi, Mumbai and have helped 96 of them secure employment. These youths now earn a monthly salary ranging from 10,000 to 15,000 rupees.



5. General Duty Assistant Course:

This course is being conducted near Narhegaon in Pune. It is designed to provide humanitarian service in hospital. It aims to promote human values, establish clean and best quality hospitals and serve patients. Through this course, 120 youths have been trained in the past year and 67 of them have been placed in jobs.

Through this program, these youths are now earning a monthly salary ranging from ten to fifteen thousand rupees per month.



6. Agricultural Empowerment Project: (Krishi Shakti Project)

The Krishi Shakti Project has been implemented in the villages of Bhagatwadi, Chirewadi and Kolewadi in the Umarga taluka. It aims to provide assistance and guidance to economically and socially vulnerable women farmers in agricultural supplementary activities, dairy farming, and goat rearing. The project includes providing information on government schemes, establishing farmer cooperatives, and assisting women through these cooperatives. Each woman is provided with a subsidy of Rs. 10,000 for the purchase of cows, buffaloes and goats. Additionally, information about the importance of organic farming, crops suitable for water-deficient regions and government benefits is provided through training sessions conducted by farmer cooperatives. Through this initiative, women have now established their own small-scale businesses, benefiting the farming community. total beneficiary 280 women farmer.





7. Mission Education Project:

The Mission Education Project has been initiated to connect school children to mainstream education in the Dharavi area. This project provides support classes and nutrition support to economical backward and neglected children and integrates them into formal education through training and educational programs. So far, 37 children have benefited from this project in current year.

Furthermore, Samaj Vikas Sanstha provided 320 stationery kits to students Z. P. school. These kits include pencils, sharpeners, notebooks and bags aimed at supporting the education of the children.



8. Farmer Training Center:

A Farmer Training Center has been established in the Umarga taluka, by the organization. The training center offers various courses on the cultivation of fruits such as mangoes, guavas, chickoo, curry leaves, and almonds. Farmers are provided with guidance on how to increase productivity in their farming practices. They are personally shown the techniques and methods and they implement them in their own fields. This program runs continuously and in the current year, around 337 farmers have visited this training center.
